Below are little/no-preparation activities you can do when technology fails to work in your class.

Warmers without technology

Longer lesson structures without technology

• Noughts and crosses

• Word snake

Finishing the class without technology

- Students make and solve anagrams from new vocabulary
- Students could do a chain story with new vocabulary: Learner A "I'm going on a picnic and I'm taking a...". Learner B: "I'm going on a picnic and I'm taking a... and a...."
- Flashcard line jump (jobs-jump left, fruit-jump right, animals-clap!)
- Students write T/F sentences based on a textbook page (could be comprehension questions)
