
### Foreword

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## Managing resources - overview

#### 1. What does Managing resources involve?

Managing resources is about selecting, developing and adapting materials for the classroom. It involves using them in a variety of ways and evaluating their effectiveness.

#### 2. What does 'selecting resources' mean?

Selecting resources includes the ability to identify where materials can be sourced from, using various forms of media (e.g. digital, audiovisual and print) relevant to your learners' needs and context and being able to make the most of the resources selected.

#### 3. What does 'developing resources' mean?

Developing resources involves using a range of authoring tools (e.g. Microsoft Word), designing good-quality, professional content, adhering to copyright regulations, acknowledging sources and creating contextually relevant content.

#### 4. What else does Managing resources include?

Finally, this professional practice also includes sharing resources with peers that meet their needs and regularly reflecting on resources used so that they are relevant and appropriate.




