#### **Activities and teaching ideas**

Name	How do we use it?	Main Focus	Target learner group
1. Linguistic landscape	Learners take pictures of the target language (e.g., imperatives or collocations) in English and their languages in the physical world around them. They bring them to class for comparing and finding commonalities or differences. For extended practice, students could make a multilingual landscape in pairs or groups.	Vocabulary and grammar	Monolingual/ Bilingual/ Multilingual
2. Multilingual stories	A. Students retell stories by incorporating elements of their language and culture.  B. Students can act out stories, with each character speaking in a different language. For instance, Goldilocks might speak English, Papa Bear might speak Spanish, Mama Bear might speak Arabic, and Baby Bear might speak Persian. They can then reenact their roles, switching between their language and English.  C. Create a multilingual storybook where students can contribute by translating a	All skills – reading, writing, listening and speaking	Monolingual/ Bilingual/ Multilingual

	part of the story into their language and illustrating it using <a href="https://bookcreator.com/">https://bookcreator.com/</a>		
3. Three key words dialogue	Choose a situation, such as ordering food at a restaurant.  Pair up the students and have them identify three key words they don't know in English related to ordering food.  As a class, try to translate all the words into English.  Have the pairs write a dialogue for the situation, using at least five of the new words. Check the dialogues as they work.  Students role play their dialogues.	All skills - reading, writing, listening and speaking	Monolingual/ Bilingual/ Multilingual
