

How to learn more English: An English action plan

Part one

- 1. Read and say what the learner is doing (reading, writing, listening or speaking).
- 2. Which idea is:
 - the most difficult?
 - the easiest?
 - the most fun?
- 3. Which hobbies and interests does this student have?

- record myself describing an animal.
- listen to a pop song and try to sing along.
- read one page of a comic book.

Every week I'm going to ...

- write a message to my grandma in English.
- read an animal story and write down new words I learn.

- play an online game in English.
- find information on the internet about a wild animal

- 1. What are your interests and hobbies? Write a list of three to five.
- 2. Work with a partner. Think of ideas for practising your English.
- 3. Choose two or three ideas for every day, every week and every month.
- 4. Write your English action plan. Draw some pictures to decorate it. Then put it in a place where you will see it every day.
