# Ignore Design Rules For Slides

including key text on static slides provides added support for ELLs in the moment (closed captioning can move too fast, not be accurate, and treat all talk as equally important)

Corollary Guideline - Speak SLOWLY

Text-heavy slides can support ELLs (and everybody else) when posted on Google Classroom so students can view them if they are absent.

#### **Breakout Rooms Rule!**



OR, at least, use that strategy of very short clips followed by questions.

### **Wait Time**

Use think/write/pair share - or share in larger breakout rooms - A LOT

BONUS: How to support ELLs who were absent...

In addition to posting slideshows.....

Have Everyone Prepare Short Summaries of What Was Learned In Class That Day (or in Previous Class) - Can provide Writing Frames, Co-Construct

Retrieval Practice Helps Everybody
