


Imagine that Aunt Selda visited the narrator's mum after a couple of months. Write a dialogue between them.







Design a sewing box.




Look at your design. Then make a sewing box and decorate it. Fill it in with some tools and label each of them.

- Use stickers or cards to label the tools.




Imagine that you are the narrator of the story. Write a stanza about the day you went to the hair salon.






Read the part of the story below and draw a cartoon of the scene. Put callouts for some characters and fill them in.
