

"Come with me and find out," he said. "Come fishing with me tomorrow."

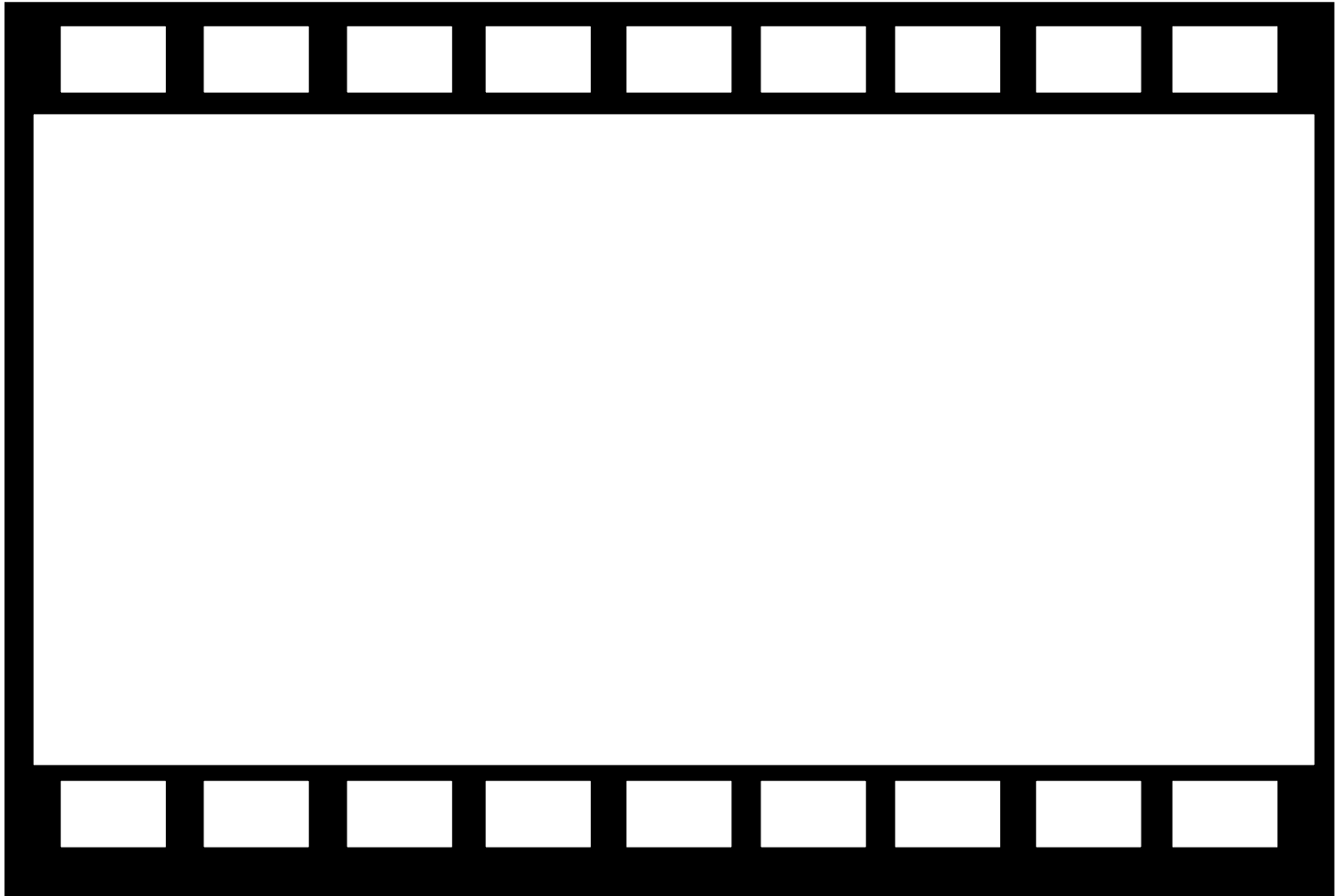
But in that moment, Tuna saw more than just his brothers. Much more.
