<i>A room at Netherfield</i>	Charles Bingley Mr Darcy Elizabeth Bennet	Mr Bingley makes the point that all girls he knows seem to be considered talented. Mr Darcy thinks that just doing some decorative manual work is not enough. A girl to be talented has to be well-read and intelligent. Therefore, he only knows a few that are really talented. Elizabeth points out that Mr Darcy has too high expectations of a woman and that she is surprised that anyone can really meet his standards.
