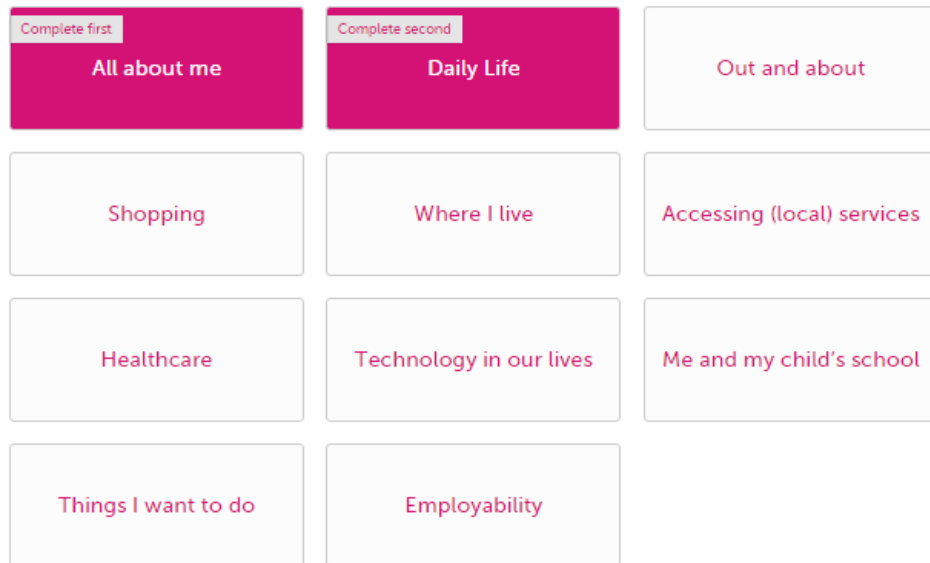

i **Differentiation:** Consider how many new words are likely to be realistic for your learners at this stage. Choose how many words you want to present to your learners; you may want to use classroom support to vary this for different groups of learners.

Learning Check

- ✓ Monitor.
- ✓ Ask learners to pair up and compare their answers as they finish.
- ✓ Go through each poster at the end, encouraging learners to give you the answers and highlighting where to find them.
